From the Rabbi

In January I devoted my Bulletin column to the story of the end of Israel's then government, the 33rd Knesset. In the column, I also explained that new elections were scheduled for March. You may recall that in addition to giving a basic primer on Israeli electoral politics, I shared my sadness that this government was dissolved. When first elected it offered new voices, new faces, and two new political parties offering new ideas. But the ideological divisions among the parties in the ruling coalition proved to be too great. And the aftermath of last summer's fighting in Gaza, the crisis in relations with the Obama administration (as well as the Israeli public's concern about this crisis), and the current state of the peace process all proved too much to hold the fragile coalition together.

When the new elections were announced, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu promised "a new, better, more stable government, a broad-based government that can govern." Yet as the 34th Knesset was sworn into office in May, the prime minister's optimistic promise was rendered hollow by the new reality.

The new government, a coalition of five parties representing differing religious, economic, and security visions, commands only a razor-thin majority of the government (61 of 120 seats, the minimum to govern). By all accounts it is among the most right-wing governments, if not the most right wing, in Israel's history, consisting of the **Likud Party**,

which is headed by Netanyahu; **Kulanu**, led by ex-Likud member Moshe Kahlon; and the **Jewish Home** party headed by Naftali Bennett, who it should be remembered severely criticized the very government of which he was a minister during last summer's war, and who has publicly stated on numerous occasions his opposition to Palestinian statehood. Completing the coalition are two ultra-Orthodox religious parties, **Shas** and **United Torah Judaism**.

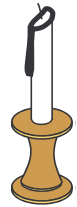
Given the platforms and ideologies of the new government, Netanyahu's pre-election promise seems unlikely. More likely is political stalemate, more economic stagnation, increased tensions with the Obama administration, and a rollback of the significant reforms initiated by the previous government to better integrate Israel's large and growing ultra-Orthodox community into society in general, and the army in particular.

Given the prominent role of the ultra-Orthodox parties in the new government (13 of 61 seats), we can also predict increased tensions among Israel's secular population as subsidies for insular religious and educational institutions – part of the government's commitment to the religious parties – are diverted from the larger economy. And the needs of the Conservative and Reform movements in Israel, long ignored by all Israeli governments, will further suffer, leading to greater tensions with American Jewry as well.

In January, I asked the community to join me in the hope and prayer that the next Israeli government will achieve greater success than the previous one. But given its current makeup, the government will need more than prayer to survive and govern effectively. It will need to better reflect all the diverse communities of Israel. It will need to better respect and understand the concerns of Israel's supporters in the Diaspora. For as always, there is so much at stake, and given Israel's precarious international position, so little margin for error.

President's Message

Speaking of weddings, Sandy and I are sponsoring the kiddush on Saturday, June 27, in honor of our 50th wedding anniversary, which is on that day.

It's hard for me to believe that my first year as president of the JCCP/CBT is quickly approaching its end. It has been a most eventful year. Let me review the major items that have occurred:

We are in the process of selling our Midland Avenue properties. At this point all is going well with the proposed sale and all appears to be in line for a closing hopefully, sometime in the fall.

We have put a new roof on our building. We no longer need to worry about the gym floor being wet or seeing pails in the hallways and rooms collecting dripping water.

Our security system has been re-done. We now have 16 cameras

constantly surveying our property for any potential danger. This project was the result of the Homeland Security grant we received two years ago.

Our proposed project with the State of New Jersey providing us with an incentive of \$125,000 to replace the air conditioner in the gym, as well as our furnaces and boilers, and to upgrade all the building fixtures to be energy efficient has been approved. As I write this article, we are waiting for the contractors to finalize the project and the materials to be installed.

The search committee for a new executive director is interviewing prospective candidates; hopefully the position will be filled shortly.

We have cut the time of our board meetings. No meeting has gone past two hours, and most have lasted only one hour. I would like to thank the board for its cooperation in helping to make this happen. We have discussed all items thoroughly with great decorum and have accepted the results in a businesslike manner.

As for my Congregants of the Month, I am very happy to honor the **Bulletin Committee** headed by **Elana Heitlinger**. The committee consists of **SANDY ALPERN, MARC BRODSKY, BETH CHANANIE, EUGENE HEITLINGER AND ESTHER MARKS; MICHELE PAPAVALIOU** is the graphic designer. The Bulletin is the face of our congregation, and this committee has put a fine face on it. Thank you all for all your hard work.

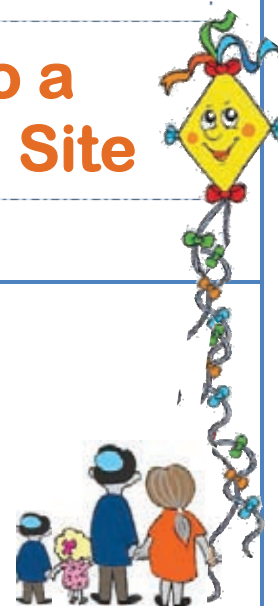

HAPPY SUMMER EVERYONE!

It's a perfect time to fire up the grill and make some delicious barbecue chicken — not using commercial barbecue sauce. For those without a grill, the recipe will also work fine baked in the oven.

Enjoy the summer — and don't forget the sunscreen!



BARBECUE CHICKEN

from Beth Chananie



Ingredients:

- 1 1/2 pounds skinless chicken breasts, or pieces, without the skin
- 3 onions, sliced in rings
- Olive oil for frying onions
- 1 1/2 cups tomato juice
- 5 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- 3/4 cup vinegar
- 3 minced garlic cloves
- 1 bay leaf
- 1/4 teaspoon dry mustard
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper (optional)
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon sugar

Preparation:

Combine all the ingredients in a saucepan, except the chicken and onions, and oil. Simmer for 20 minutes and set aside.

If barbecuing: it marinate overnight (or at least a few hours) in the refrigerator.

In a separate frying pan, saute the onions and set aside. Spray a grill with non-stick spray and gently grill the cutlets, basting frequently. Do not overcook.

When ready to serve, add the sauteed onions on top of the chicken in a platter.

If using a conventional oven: Spray a baking dish with vegetable oil spray and put the chicken in a single layer, covering with the sauce and onion slices. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. Turn chicken over, baste again, and try to put some onions on top, and bake for another 20 minutes.

THE FOOL-PROOF RECIPE

Preparation time: 2-3 months/about 1 week hands-on time

Serves: At least 45 women

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 group of dedicated women
- A generous helping of concern for the JCCP/CBT
- 1 idea
- A dash of money
- A few hours a month (2-3)
- 4 boxes of Betty Crocker chocolate and vanilla cake mixes (dairy)
- 4 containers of Betty Crocker frosting — chocolate, vanilla and strawberry (dairy)
- A lot of cake decorations (available at The Chocolate Shop in Dumont)
- Oil
- Eggs
- Cupcake tins and cupcake liners
- Pretty paper goods
- Some little things to put on the tables (cute decorations/pretzels)

DIRECTIONS:

1. Present an idea to a dedicated, creative group of women.
2. Let the idea rest a while until it congeals.
3. Vote on whether the idea is acceptable; it generally will be.
4. Sit around a table and discuss details.
5. Volunteer to take on one or two tasks, i.e., work on publicity, plan refreshments, shop, etc.
6. Make sure lots and lots of emails are circulated so that nothing falls through the cracks. (These can be humorous, serious, opinionated – whatever works best in the moment.)
7. As the event date nears, set a schedule, i.e., cooking or baking 2 days before.
8. Prepare work orders – correctly!
9. Get together. Blend the first 5 ingredients with the remaining 7 ingredients. Make sure there's plenty of laughter in the room.
10. Platter the finished and decorated cupcakes.
11. Set the tables.
12. Enjoy the event and being together!

We promise, if you try this recipe, you won't be disappointed!

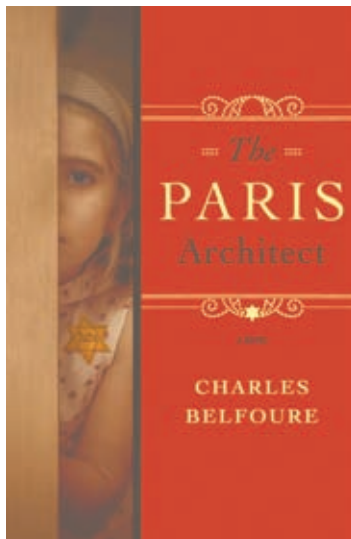
