From the Rabbi



Rabbi Arthur D. Weiner

One of the great strengths of The Jewish Community Center of Paramus is our daily morning and evening minyans. I wonder if our members are fully aware of what a wonderful statement our ability to maintain an active minyan makes about us. Sadly, many congregations, even those larger than the JCCP, are unable to maintain theirs. In addition to our own attendees, people from Maywood, Fair Lawn, Glen Rock, New Milford, Woodcliff Lake and others communities regularly join with us.

Some feel strongly about the mitzvah to daven (pray) regularly in the presence of a minyan. Others are mourning loved ones or observing Yahrzeit and wish to recite the Mourner's Kaddish at the appropriate times. Some are motivated by other needs. Yet all who attend share an interest in seeing the

success of this aspect of our congregation, and even more of our members participate in it.

Some years ago Rabbi Irving Spielman, Rabbi Emeritus of The Jewish Community Center of Fort Lee, wrote the following regarding the worth and value of the minyan in his community. I hope his eloquent words will inspire you as well.

For many, many years, I have watched so many people come to the daily minyan. The daily minyan is truly the heart of synagogue life. All of us at some point in our lives expect to recite Kaddish for parents or for loved ones. Death is a reality we all must face. It is an age-old tradition to recite Kaddish for the dead. Many times I have heard bereaved people explain to me how important saying Kaddish is to them, and how they have felt healed in the process of remembering the loss of a loved one.

The minyan actually serves many purposes. It soothes those suffering from a recent loss, connects people to their tradition and their community, and allows a mourner to perform a concrete act connected with his or her loss. The minyan also creates a sense of community when people are new to an area or are reaching out for avenues of religious expression.

The minyan is certainly a great comfort for any of us who say Kaddish, either for a Yahrzeit or for the year of mourning, to be assured of the

presence of a daily minyan twice a day at our synagogue. There are those who attend on a regular basis and are not necessarily saying Kaddish. Those who are always there are the unsung heroes of our synagogue community. When the weather is inclement, when the snow is falling, when the rain is pouring, when the wind is blowing, when the temperature is below zero – these people make a special effort to be there.

These are people who daily are willing to get up very early in the morning or hurry through their supertime in order to help. These are all people who care about other people in a very special way.

One need not be a mourner to attend a morning or evening minyan. One need not be an expert in prayer or even knowledgeable about the service in order to participate. One only needs to be Jewish, feel Jewish and want to do the Jewish thing. There is always room for one more at the morning and evening minyan. YOU, BE COUNTED!

I am moved to write about the minyan this month because I am concerned about our minyan. We have had a difficult time over the past few months. We have too many days where we have had to make phone calls to try to make a minyan, and this puts a great deal of pressure on those who have made a regular commitment. Additionally, it becomes harder and harder to recruit new people to make a regular commitment. The dedication of our regular attendees is inspiring, but they carry an unfair burden.

Simply, we need your help to make minyan attendance a greater aspect of your commitment to synagogue. Additionally, we need you to talk about the importance of the minyan to others and its role in the Jewish Community Center of Paramus. You can play a great role in helping to strengthen our minyan.

I look forward to your support of our minyan. Your efforts make all the difference.

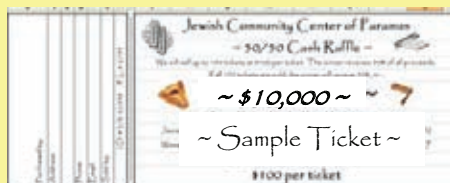

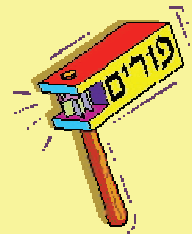

President's Message

I hope no one was upset with the secrecy that was imposed on Joe, the rabbi and myself during the first three weeks of January as the arson case in Bergen County was unfolding. We were in close and constant communication with the Paramus Police, the Bergen County Police and the Sheriff's Office, as well as the Bergen County Prosecutor. My friend Steven Rothman, the congressman in this district, assured me that the office of the Bergen County Prosecutor and the FBI were doing everything in their power to find the arsonist(s) and that all the resources of those agencies would be used to catch and arrest them. The evidence that they found on our property as well as our surveillance tapes were instrumental in his eventual arrest and indictment. (They really had their local CSI unit working on the evidence we provided, just like on TV!)

As soon as the Bergen County Prosecutor announced the indictment, identifying our synagogue as one of his targets, we were able to address the issue publicly with our membership, which we did less than five minutes after the prosecutor's press conference in Hackensack was over. I am convinced that the increased patrols by the Paramus Police were directly responsible for preventing the arsonist's plot to attack us. For that we should all be grateful.

But we are also compelled to take whatever additional steps we can to safeguard our synagogue and

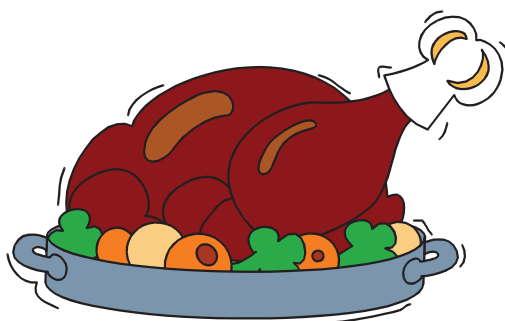
protect our congregants. More than a year ago we had a security assessment of our facility by Bergen County and Paramus officials, and we are in pretty good shape considering the age of our building and because of the wonderful care that previous leadership has taken. We will be pricing out whatever improvements were recommended and it is our hope that these costs will be covered by a Department of Homeland Security grant for which we intend to apply when the monies become available. In addition, we already are improving on our security and surveillance systems, some of which you may notice and others that you won't see.

We are also reviewing our building fire and emergency evacuation plans, the layout of our fire extinguishers and their identification and locations. Our panic buttons have been tested with the police to make sure they are functioning properly. In summary, we are doing all we can to make sure our buildings and its occupants are always safe.

As Joe, Harlan and I participate in the many security sessions and meetings hosted by Federation and county officials, one thing is mentioned most often: Each institution needs to take personal responsibility to protect their buildings and people. Increased vigilance and reporting anything suspicious is the first line of defense. We recently signed up our synagogue with the Community Security Service, a non-profit organization working with our local Federation to help train volunteers to be able to protect their own communities through awareness training, knowledge of risks and suspicious activity, scenario training, self-defense, emergency procedure reviews for schools and synagogues, and more. If any members are interested in participating in these classes or learning more about them, please don't hesitate to call or speak to Joe or myself. It is our goal to make everyone feel as comfortable in this home as they do in their own home.

Early Childhood Center News

*What do we do on Purim day?
On Purim day, on Purim day...*

What do we do on Purim day? The question asked in this song (melody: "Lazy Mary") is easily answered if you spend the weeks leading up to Purim at the Early Childhood Center.

With our usual goal of integrating this holiday into the basic curriculum areas of literacy, math, science, music, cooking and so forth, we begin at the beginning, with a story. "A very, very long time ago..." We do skew the story a little, presenting Vashti as a self-assertive woman (she's actually a great role model for little girls) and eliminating the "beauty contest" aspect of the search for a new queen, emphasizing instead positive values like kindness. We also send away

Haman, out of Shushan, rather than have him meet the end described in the traditional *Megillah*. We tell and retell the story in a variety of ways, using a giant hand-made Megillah, puppets, books, chalk talks and songs.

All the time-honored, child-friendly activities associated with Purim take place at our Early Childhood Center, but some with a new curricular twist. We prepare dough, bake and eat hamantaschen, for example, and we graph children's (and teachers!) favorite flavor. We make shalach manot for our families, and the older children write their own individual cards. We make a variety of graggers and experiment with different sound modalities: fast, slow, soft, loud and louder! We tie-dye T-shirts for costumes, and use the opportunity to learn how primary colors blend into new color combinations. We talk about Haman's triangular hat, and do all sorts of math and fine-motor activities involving triangles and "three-ness." And speaking of triangles, we serve a special triangular lunch to the children during Purim week — PIZZA!

Purim is fun, Purim is festive and, like all experiences, Purim is educational, when we explore the holiday in a variety of new ways. Chag Purim Sameach!
