From the Rabbi

Earlier this year, our synagogue voted to replace our synagogue's *siddurim* (prayer books). Perhaps you have noticed that for the past two months, we have been using the new Siddur Sim Shalom for Shabbat and Festivals in our sanctuary. The new siddur has been met with approval and much enthusiasm from our membership.

Why did we make the difficult but necessary switch from the Silverman Siddur to this new one? To answer the question, we must begin with a few words about what a siddur is. A siddur is a compendium of prayers for religious services and events. As a traditionally oriented Conservative synagogue, we generally follow a fixed liturgy for most of our religious services.

Nonetheless, editorial choices must be made when assembling such a compendium, as I have tried to explain to both our Religious Committee and Board of Trustees. Learned men and women who are steeped both in the Jewish liturgical tradition and sensitive to the needs of the community must balance often competing values to create a prayer book that not only will meet the religious needs of the current generation but also anticipate the needs of future worshippers.

In that respect, the Silverman Siddur that served our congregation for more than 50 years was a masterpiece. It offered a clear and well-presented Hebrew text, a highly readable (though somewhat stilted) English translation, and reflect-

ed both the confidence and the optimism of American Jewry as it emerged in the post-World War II era. In terms of presentation, it was a marked improvement over the prayer books used in most traditional synagogues in the previous generation.

As it has been almost two generations since the Silverman Siddur was introduced to the Jewish community, we may not be aware of how the Silverman was considered quite radical in some respects, making changes in prayers and other editorial changes that were quite controversial in its time.

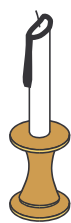
Based on the needs articulated to our Religious Committee, we have been thinking about our prayer books for many years. Seven years ago we introduced a new transliterated siddur, the Siddur for Shabbat of the Jewish Community Center of Paramus, to assist community members who wished to participate in our religious services yet lacked the Hebrew skills necessary for the regular siddur. The Siddur for Shabbat has continued to make a most positive impact in our religious services. But new and emerging needs articulated by our membership made the consideration of a new prayer book a priority.

After much consideration, we decided that we needed a siddur with improved English translations reflecting not only the common English of today's America, but also one that was more sensitive to gender issues. We also looked for a siddur with more transliteration to improve the prayer experience of those lacking Hebrew fluency. We wanted a siddur that reflected our sense of the religious significance of the State of Israel (remember that Israel had not yet become an independent nation when the Silverman Siddur was originally published). We also wanted a siddur that would help us achieve our goal of facilitating both traditional and egalitarian religious opportunities, so that by offering different options, we could increase opportunities for learning and Jewish growth for all members of the community.

It was not an easy choice. We considered and rejected several outstanding works before we settled

on Siddur Sim Shalom. We believe it has the right combination of faithfulness to the Jewish liturgical tradition, uplifting and accessible English translations and additional readings, interesting explanatory notes as well as aesthetic appeal that will serve the needs of our congregation today and for many years in the future.

Next time you are in the synagogue, I hope you will take the time to familiarize yourself with our new prayer book. The Religious Committee conducted its deliberations on this important synagogue matter with you in mind. I have every confidence it will meet your needs and exceed your expectations.

Three years ago the JCCP had a pre-price increase sale, and this year for a limited time only, we will be running another pre-price increase sale. Graves can only be purchased by current members of the JCCP, as well as by their Jewish family members. Family members include all relationships based on birth, including all cousins. Family members also include all relationships based on marriage, including all Jewish in-laws. The current cost of a grave is \$1,000, but as of July 1, the price will increase to \$1,200.

I hope everyone's Pesach was sweet and festive, like mine. My wife and I particularly enjoyed having all the family at our home. We spent quality time with our kids and grandchildren. My granddaughter, who is 5 1/2 years old, chanted the Four Questions by herself in Hebrew, totally by heart!

One topic most people don't like to think about or discuss is the purchase of graves for themselves or their family members. For those of you who are not aware, the JCCP owns graves in Cedar Park-Beth El Cemetery, and they are only available to be purchased by our members.

President's Message

Shalom,

As the President of the Jewish Community Center, I have the responsibility of informing the Congregation when there is both joyful news and when there is sad news. This letter clearly falls into the latter category.

With much sadness, it is my task to report that on March 21, 2013, the Board of Trustees, acting on the recommendations of both the Board of Education and the Executive Board, voted to close the Dora and Sidney Miller Early Childhood Center following the conclusion of the school year in June. Our Early Childhood Center, or nursery school, as so many of us

still affectionately call it, has had a distinguished history that spans more than four decades. The ECC helped to bring a first-class Jewish education to hundreds of our children and gave them a firm foundation for future success in school, in life and in their future careers as educators, attorneys, doctors, businesspeople and even rabbis.

The ECC was also one of the great building blocks of the social networks and long-lasting friendships for both children and parents alike that have made the JCCP such a special place over the years. I can honestly say that if not for the ECC, which all three of our children attended, Lori and I would not have become and remained members of the JCCP and I would not be serving as your President today. The close friendships we formed at the ECC more than twenty years ago are still at the core of our JCCP friendships today.

The enclosed letter was sent to our current ECC families right after the Board voted informing them of this emotionally difficult decision. The Board's decision, reflecting the work of two ECC task forces and months of intensive

discussions that were preceded by years of ongoing discussions, was driven in large measure by the harsh demographic, competitive and financial challenges which the ECC has confronted during recent years. Based on the enrollment outlook for the coming year, the hard realities could no longer be avoided.

I would like to take this opportunity to both applaud and thank our current ECC Director, Judy Fox, who took over the position three years ago at a very challenging time. Judy has worked tirelessly, creatively and with the utmost professionalism to try to restore our ECC program to prominence and profitability. She has been ably assisted in that endeavor by her dedicated staff of teachers, Harriet Cohen, Janet Ritter, Eileen Shapiro, Karen Silverman, Debbie Zeiler as well as Janie Horowitz, who have been with us for many years and in Harriet's case, more than two decades. We thank all of them for their steadfast devotion to both the ECC and to our children.

I would also like to recognize the accomplishments of Paula Javits, along with her teaching staff, who made the program such a success

during her 36-year tenure as the Director of our ECC. I would also like to acknowledge and publicly thank the Miller family for the crucial and generous financial support which they have extended over the years to our ECC program.

On behalf of the entire JCCP community, now and over the past 42 years, we thank all of you for helping to launch our children on the path of both life and Jewish education, and for helping to strengthen the educational, social and religious fabric of the JCCP. Our entire community is indebted to each of you. While the ECC will be sorely missed by our community, there is no doubt that for those of us whose children were fortunate enough to attend our nursery school, we will forever have warm memories of what a special place it was. In future years, whenever we use those special plastic Seder plates our children made at the ECC so many years ago or look at our children's smiling faces on their nursery school refrigerator magnets, it will always be a bitter-sweet moment.

Cantor Sam & Raisy Weiss



Every year, the Israel Bonds Committee at the Jewish Community Center of Paramus holds an event in the spring to raise money for the State of Israel and to honor special members of our community for their longtime support of the State of Israel. This year we are honoring two exceptional people — a couple who are lifelong supporters of the State of Israel as well as longtime members of the JCCP.

Cantor Sam Weiss became a full-time Hazzan in 1976 and served congregations in Norwich, Conn.; Wilmington, Del.; and Baltimore until 1997. In that year he returned to his and wife Raisy's native Northeast to become Cantor of the Jewish Community Center of Paramus.

Six years earlier, Dr. Raisy Weiss had already made her professional move northward when she was appointed professor at Lehigh University, where she currently chairs the Philosophy Department.

At the JCCP's 2007 Selichot reception and again at its 2011 Dinner Dance, the JCCP recognized our Cantor's excellence in prayer leadership, teaching, choral conducting, innovative programming, scholarship — topped off by the more than 300 B'nai Mitzvah students he has taught with affection and helped guide toward Jewish and personal maturity.

Raisy's contributions to the congregation were acknowledged as well, including her work with our JCCP Singers, homeless shelter, book club, and Drosh 'n Nosh programs.

Cantor and Raisy are both highly regarded and accomplished members of their chosen professional fields. Much sought after for his expertise in liturgical, religious and folk traditions, Cantor Weiss regularly answers internet inquiries from all over the world on these and related subjects. In his induction as an Honorary Fellow of the H.L. Miller Cantorial School, The Jewish Theological Seminary cited him as "exemplifying the ideal of Hazzan-scholar." He is a contributing editor of The Journal of Synagogue Music, and a writer and performer for the

United Synagogue's acclaimed "Voices of the Conservative Movement" series of recordings. He is a recipient of the Cantors Assembly's Samuel Rosenbaum Award for Creativity and Scholarship, and serves on the organization's Executive Council.

Raisy has authored four books on Plato and published many articles on Greek and Jewish Philosophy. She is currently working on the first complete English translation of "Or Hashem," the major work by medieval Jewish philosopher Hasdai Crescas. She has lectured all over the country (including twice for the JCCP's George Reiss Memorial Lecture program) and in many cities throughout Canada and Europe. Raisy's lectures have taken her as far as Greece and Japan, but she is proudest of her

regular presentations in Israel — 20 and still counting — which represent her commitment to *Eretz Yisrael* as much as her commitment to scholarship. Raisy is a regular proud JCCP marcher at the Israel Day Parade and is a life member of Hadassah and AMIT.

The Weiss daughters, Miriam and Dena, both have spent time studying in Israel, and the entire family staunchly supports Israel. Separately and together, they have made more than 40 trips to the country and look forward to more in the future.

Cantor Sam and Raisy Weiss will be adding substantially to their current Israel Bonds holdings, and invite you to do the same — or if you have not done so, to start contributing this year.
