Cantor Morris Rosenblatt

Morris Rosenblatt grew up on the Lower East Side of New York. He attended yeshiva elementary and high school in New York, and then City College and Yeshiva University, the last two simultaneously.

Following his rabbinic ordination in 1947, and prior to his marriage to Shirley, Morris worked as educational director of the Adath Jeshurun Hebrew School in Pittsburgh. He and Shirley had a long-distance romance, involving trips between New York and Pittsburgh, where Morris was studying for a master's degree in math and science at the University of Pittsburgh.

The Rosenblatts were married in 1952 and settled for a short time in Pittsburgh. Following his studies in Pennsylvania, Morris, already an ordained rabbi, joined the Air Force as a chaplain, stationed first at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas, and subsequently in places as exotic as Casablanca and Libya.

Cantor Rosenblatt, after occupying two rabbinic pulpits, earned a master's degree from Yeshiva University and then studied cantorial music at the Herzl Institute. He was influ-

enced by the legendary Cantor David Koussevitzky. Cantor Rosenblatt earned a second master's degree, in education, following his military service. He taught mathematics at Fair Lawn High School for 25 years until his retirement in 1984. A lifelong student, he continued to study Talmud on a daily basis until his death in 2008.

The Rosenblatts have two children, Shera and Raymond. Raymond is married and living in Clifton with his wife, Rachel, and their three daughters, Kayla, Emily and Becky. Shera and her husband, Bob Nussbaum, live in Manhattan with their daughter, Aviva.

In 1995 our congregation paid special tribute to Cantor Rosenblatt on the occasion of his retiring as our bar and bat mitzvah teacher. Students from his 10-year tenure came to the event, bearing testimony to the extent to which he was admired, respected and loved. The JCCP was blessed for many years with the presence of a Torah reader of his skill, dedication, musical talent, and all-around ability.

On Saturday, Sept. 24, the Aron Kodesh in the Bodeen Chapel will be dedicated as a lasting memorial to honor our Cantor Emeritus Morris Rosenblatt, of blessed memory, for all he contributed to our synagogue and to our lives.

From the Rabbi

As our September Bulletin reaches you, we are literally in the countdown to Rosh Hashanah and the High Holidays period. It is a time of excitement, anticipation and, especially for rabbis, cantors and synagogue leaders, even anxiety. The season holds great promise. A new year and all the possibilities it offers is almost upon us, and we want to make it special. But we have been here before. What can we do now to help ready ourselves for this most significant period in the Jewish year? How can we insure that we experience some of the possibilities and even transformation that the High Holidays season is all about?

Our rabbis teach us that we can only reap the rewards of this season by preparing for them in a serious fashion.

In Elul, the Hebrew month that precedes Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, we make a certain type of communal preparation a part of our daily prayer. Each morning and evening we add the words of the 27th Psalm to our liturgy as its poetry and compelling imagery reinforce some of the great themes and ideas of the High Holidays period. We also add shofar blowing as well, for it also helps to draw our attention to the fast approaching New Year. Through ancient words and sounds our level of awareness is raised.

But what of those who while certainly respectful and mindful of these responses to the ap-

proaching holidays cannot find within them the impetus to stop and think about this season of the year? Or of those who even while participating in these observances find them lacking? Or for any Jew who wants to experience more of what these days mean but finds it hard to discern that meaning through the words and experiences of previous generations (that is all of us, I suspect, at one time or another)? What are the resources that are available?

I want to help all the members of the JCCP family and those who look to our synagogue for religious meaning and inspiration to find new resources and sources of strength that along with our traditional prayers, rituals and observances can offer us new ideas for preparing for the holidays, enjoying them, finding greater meaning and pleasure while celebrating them, and carry something of great personal value from the experience into the New Year. So in order to begin the process, I want to share two pieces, written by wise and sensitive rabbis, to get us thinking.

1. "QUESTIONS FOR A MEANINGFUL LIFE – The Rosh Hashanah/ Yom Kippur Survival Kit," by Rabbi Shimon Apisdorf

- *When do I most feel that my life is meaningful?*
- *Those who mean the most to me – have I ever told them how I feel?*
- *Are there any ideals I would be willing to die for?*
- *If I could live my life over, would I change anything?*
- *What would bring me more happiness than anything else in the world?*
- *What are my three most significant achievements since last Rosh Hashanah?*
- *What are the three biggest mistakes I've made since last Rosh Hashanah?*
- *What project or goal, if left undone, will I most regret next Rosh Hashanah?*

• *If I knew I couldn't fail, what would I undertake to accomplish in life?*

• *What are my three major goals in life? What am I doing to achieve them? What practical steps can I take in the next two months toward these goals?*

• *If I could only give my children three pieces of advice, what would they be?*

2. "THE TOP OF THE TELL" by Rabbi David Wolpe

Have you ever climbed to the top of a tell? A tell is a pile of old civilizations massed atop each other. Such hills mark the landscape of Israel, reminding us that civilization is less about building than about rebuilding.

What is true for many civilizations throughout centuries is true for a single civilization through the years. There is always erosion and collapse. Sustaining the blessings we have requires constant rebuilding. Hanukkah, after all, is the holiday not of the dedication of the

Temple but of rededication. Rededication and rebuilding is constant in societies and civilizations.

Rebuilding is also a constant throughout our lives. Life is flux and change. Some things remain the same, but much requires rediscovery and rebuilding. We make new configurations of the qualities we have, much as a new culture takes the material from all that went before. In time, our lives are as tells: the new built on the old with unimagined possibilities unfolding.

There are ruined buildings, said the Scottish poet Hugh MacDiarmid, but there are no ruined stones. The raw material of societies and personalities endure. We must renew, always renew; what we build may be different than what went before, but from the top of the tell there is a beautiful view.

I hope that these two selections from these thoughtful and outstanding rabbis will encourage you to consider the High Holidays season in bold new ways. I wish you all a healthy and happy New Year.

Early Childhood Center News

A year ago, my first season as director of the Dora and Sidney Miller ECC, I thought we were having the most fabulous summer imaginable. We had happy children, a wonderful staff, pretty cooperative weather, and a lot of fun. What could be better? Now I know the answer.

What could be better? **This summer** was better! This summer was more than twice as good because we had more than twice the number of children as last summer and nearly twice the number of adult staff! We had more Full Campers (ages 3-5) and more Mini-Campers (age 2). And for the first time, we had had a summer session of "My Toddler and Me," the class for 16- to 24-month-olds and their parents, which I teach. Also new this summer, we held a sort of Mini-University — a four-session series with four special activities that was a delight for all who participated, including me and the other adults.

This summer we acquired several pieces of new water-play equipment and sprinklers because the law no longer allows us to use unfiltered wading pools. One of

the new items is a flow-through sink: To make water flow through the faucet, a child had to push a pumping mechanism. What fun! — and what a learning experience, as children experimented with cause and effect, physics, and water pressure.

This summer we had a staff par excellence. Headed by Morah Janet Ritter, our staff included Morah Pearl Hart and Emily Ritter, plus counselors Alana Link, whom we welcomed back from last summer, and Julianna Haar. The staff cooperated magnificently to ensure an optimal experience for our children.

And **this summer** we were not (as of this writing) rained out even once! There has never been a day we had to be indoors because of wet weather. We were, of course, "hotted out" — wasn't that heat wave during the week of July 22 just awful? There were a few days when we kept the children superhydrated with extra water and extra ice pops, extended water-play time and stayed indoors after lunchtime.

All in all, **this summer** was stupendous. And the school year will be even better!

Spaces are still available at our ECC for 2011-12. We feature a stimulating developmental curriculum, nurturing teachers, an enriched Jewish program, and our spectacular playground. If you have a child, grandchild or neighbor "of age," I would love to personally show you our facility and program. Even if you're not accompanied by a child, please come say hello to us up on the hill at East 278 Midland Avenue.

June 16, 2011 and July 21, 2011

Our Executive Director Joe Herrmann reported that our membership count is at 434. We hope to have the credit card program up and running by August 1. Our scaffolding should be delivered the week of July 25th and this will enable us to do repairs around the building. Repairs on the back wall in the gym will start soon. We are negotiating for Kaplan Test Prep to rent our classrooms for their courses.

Our treasurer Paul Auerbach reported that cash flow is typically low this time of year, and we discussed different payment options for collecting membership dues.

The House Committee reported that the ceiling in the sanctuary is in desperate need of repair or replacement. There was a lengthy discussion about options for raising the funds needed to continue maintaining our aging building.

Phyllis Glatzer was nominated to replace the trustee position that was available when Harriet Kugler assumed her new position as Financial Secretary.

Mimi Levin thanked everyone for his or her participation in the Dinner Dance, and reported that we had another successful year.

Roz Gerard shared that the Community Affairs Committee suffered a great loss with the passing of Fran Leib, and asked that everyone continue donating food and filling our collection bin during the summer months. We will be participating in the UJA Mitzvah Day once again.

Sisterhood and Men's Club presented the JCCP with checks from their fundraising efforts throughout the year.

The Israel Awareness Committee reported that we will host a screening of "Crossing the Line" on August 9 at 7 p.m.

The Maccabeats will be performing at the JCCP on October 9 at 3 p.m.

We will have an Art Auction on December 3. Showing starts at 7 p.m. and auction begins at 8 p.m.

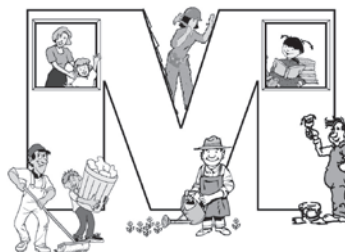
