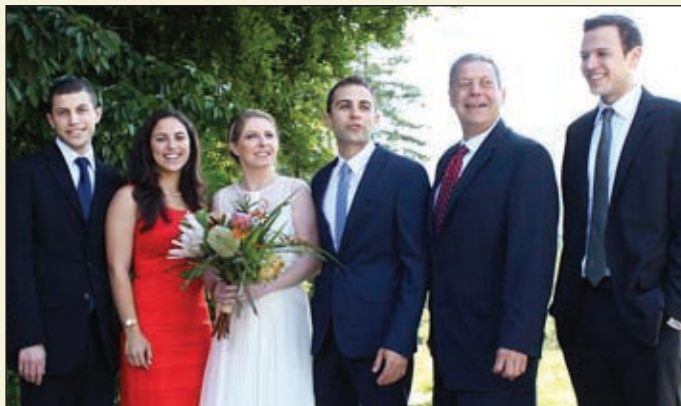

Harold and Debbie Kaplan moved to Paramus with their four children in 1996 after plenty of house hunting and shul shopping. Jeff was in fourth grade, Eric in second grade, and Shaina and Matthew were in kindergarten.

Belonging to a synagogue within walking distance of their home was a necessity for them, and the Kaplans liked the Jewish Community Center of Paramus even before they purchased their home. They both came from traditional backgrounds, although Debbie was raised in an Orthodox home. The Kaplan children attended the

Solomon Schechter Day School of Bergen County. Matt attended the JCCP Hebrew school, and all four Kaplan kids were b'nai mitzvah at the JCCP.

Debbie Gittleman and Harold Kaplan had met at a Fort Lee High School adult coed volleyball evening class. They married in June 1985 and lived in Fort Lee and Leonia before buying their home in Paramus.

Debbie grew up in Brooklyn, N.Y. She graduated from Cooper Union and also earned a master's degree in civil engineering. She worked for the Port Authority of New York.

Harold grew up in Fresh Meadows, Queens, but his family moved to San Juan, Puerto Rico, when he was 11. Harold celebrated his bar mitzvah in San Juan, which had a small Jewish community. His grandfather died when Harold was 13, and Harold accompanied his father to shul to say Kaddish. It was Harold's first experience with the importance of community support for a minyan of mourners, a value he holds to this day.

Harold's family moved to Fort Lee when he was a senior in high school. He attended Rutgers and then worked at the A & S in Brooklyn while studying at NYU for his MBA. Harold worked in the garment industry for his entire career; he retired in January 2013.

Upon joining the JCCP, the Kaplans immediately made friends and became involved in synagogue life. After a call from Nina Glaser representing the Religious Committee, Harold made a commitment to the Wednesday morning minyan. Debbie became especially active especially in the areas of religious life and youth programming. In a few years she was a member of the Religious Committee, co-chair of the Youth Committee, and a member of the Board of Trustees.

Tragically, Debbie was killed in the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001. The synagogue was a source of tremendous comfort and support to the entire Kaplan family, especially when Eric celebrated his bar mitzvah in 2002. The JCCP/CBT has remained an important part of the Kaplans' lives.

After Debbie's death, Harold came to the JCCP to say Kaddish every day. He appreciated the fact that other synagogue members attended to ensure a minyan so he and others could say Kaddish. Since then, Harold comes to evening minyans almost daily to support others while they are saying Kaddish. When more men are needed, he calls Matthew, who often is the 10th man.

Jeff, Eric, Shaina and Matthew have been active in the religious life of the JCCP. They attended services with their parents every week and, in turn, they helped run the Shabbat morning Junior Congregation. They were all involved with USY; Eric was president of the JCCP chapter. Matt worked with Fred Weisman, the youth adviser.

Jeff was married to Emily Linden in July. They live in California, where Jeff is studying at the University of California, Berkeley for his doctorate in philosophy. He graduated from Williams College and also has a master's degree from Cambridge University.

Eric graduated from Rutgers University and has a master's in public administration from NYU, where he is working on a second master's degree in Jewish studies. He lives on the Upper West Side of Manhattan.

Matthew graduated from Rutgers University in June and lives in Paramus.

Shaina graduated from Colgate University in June and lives in Baltimore, where she works for M & T Bank.

From the Rabbi

"In 24 years in the active Rabbinate, I have never written my High Holiday Bulletin article this early in the summer! As I write this message to you, it is still a week before Tisha b'Av, the saddest day of the Jewish year..."

With those words, I began my High Holidays Bulletin article last year. About a year later, I am writing this year's message to you. What a difference one year can make! Now I've completed 25 years in the active Rabbinate. And I'm writing this message a full three weeks earlier, relative to the Jewish calendar, than I wrote last year's article.

Last year when I wrote the pre-High Holidays Bulletin article, our merger with the New Milford Jewish Center was in its infancy. A year later it has been a tremendous success, as we have truly become one congregation and one community. In other words, so many things have changed and are different this year than last year. I might not have realized all the possibilities for change last year, but I would go on and live them, both professionally and personally. So have all of you.

Our Judaism teaches that both change itself and the uniquely human experience to understand that we are as capable of change as are the events and circumstances around us is of paramount religious significance.

That awareness is the point of the High Holidays season each year. The countdown to the High Holidays and the High Holidays

themselves remind us that life is dynamic, not static. Just as events change, relationships change, and the world around us changes, **we change, too.** The beauty and the wisdom of the High Holidays experience remind us that we, to a large degree, can affect and direct those changes. They remind us that we are more powerful than we may realize.

Ancient pagan religious doctrine taught that humanity was destined to fate. Our forbears were cogs in a larger wheel over which they exercised no real control. Things were the way they were, and there was very little that people could do to change the events that ruled their lives. Yet from literally its first words, our Torah taught a new vision of God. The new vision opened up a new understanding of human possibilities. This God and his teachings taught that humanity had free will. We had choices, and with those choices we could shape and influence, even change, our circumstances. It was not always to be easy, and there were no guarantees.

Additionally, we were responsible for the choices that we would make. Yet with those choices came great power. Both Jewish and all of Western civilization was built upon those teachings. The High Holidays remind us of this truth every year.

So whether they seem early or late, whether we are ready for them or not, the High Holidays will soon be upon us. Their message of the possibility of change, and our power to break from past habits and modes of behavior that hold us back, is as important and bold today as it was when first shared with our ancestors 3,300 years ago. Our ancestors did great things with this knowledge and power. So must we -- for ourselves, for our families, for our communities and for the furtherance of Jewish life.

I am also pleased to announce that we will again offer a Family High Holidays Service on the first day of Rosh Hashanah and on Yom Kippur.

In addition to the services in the Sanctuary and Stark Hall, and the extensive children's programming, we want to offer an additional opportunity for learning, teaching and experiencing the High Holidays where parents and children (and others who might be interested!) can gather together on Rosh Hashanah. Please see the separate information in the Bulletin about this wonderful opportunity.

Our High Holidays Review Committee has listened carefully to the many comments, compliments,

concerns and critiques of our High Holidays services. We have worked hard to address the issues you raised in order to create the best experience for our entire community. Your needs and feedback are critical to our efforts, and we thank everyone who participated in our surveys and research.

Let me take this opportunity to wish each of you a *L'Shana Tovah U'Metukah*, a sweet and happy new year. May it be a year of blessing for us, our synagogue family, our great nation and all Israel.

The monthly choice will be mine alone, although I may take suggestions. This person may or not be a member of the Board of Trustees. In addition to being the Congregant of the Month in my monthly column, the recipient will also be honored with a cake at

either an oneg Shabbat or Shabbat kiddush during that month.

The first Congregant of the Month is **David Luria**.

David and his wife, Hilda, have been members of our schul for about 20 years. David has been active in almost all aspects of our community. His daughter and son-in-law Nina and Gary Glaser and their two children have been active longtime members of the JCCP/CBT as well. For years, David has davened Pseukei Dzimra both on the High Holidays and Shabbat. He also serves as gabbai helping the High Holidays clergy. This year he co-chaired the committee that ran our very successful community Passover seder; currently he is a member of the Casino Night Committee. In addition, David volunteers often for whatever Nina signs him up for.

David, very simply, thank you.

"I would like to take this opportunity to welcome Elana Heitlinger and Phyllis Glatzer to the Bulletin Committee. They are taking the places of Debbie Barbash and Sue Greenberg, who after many years have given up their roles on the committee. I thank Debbie and Sue for all their contributions.

As I write this column, we are still actively attempting to sell our properties next door and find a tenant to replace Palisades Regional Academy. Hopefully we will resolve these issues in the not too distant future.

It has been over a year since the New Milford Jewish Center/Congregation Beth Tikvah merged with the JCCP, creating the Jewish Community Center of Paramus/Congregation Beth Tikvah. To honor this anniversary, we are planning simchas for a Shabbat weekend in November. More information to follow next month. Please plan to attend so we can celebrate this milestone in our schul's history together.

I hope you are aware that we have some ways to obtain free money for the schul.

- Go to TD Bank and register your account in its Affinity Program. We get "X" dollars from the bank if you maintain an account with the bank; no private information is divulged. Just tell the bank that you want the JCCP/CBT to receive some good for you doing business with it. Ask the rest of our family, friends and even businesses to register as friends of the JCCP/CBT.
- Regardless of our individual financial situation, we all have to eat. We sell scrip for both Shop-Rite and Fairway supermarkets; for every dollar in scrip purchased, the schul receives 5% back. It costs you nothing – you get a dollar of scrip for each dollar you pay. If each of our some 400 member units were to purchase \$500 in scrip annually, the benefit to the schul would be \$10,000. The only cost to you

may be 500 reward miles because you did not use your credit card; I believe trading those 500 reward miles to benefit the JCCP/CBT is not such a bad idea.

- Most of us make purchases from Amazon. Are you aware that on the JCCP/CBT website, the left side of the home page has a link to Amazon? If you make a purchase from Amazon through this link (and only this link), the schul receives a rebate. It doesn't cost you a penny!
- Additionally, there is a link in the same location on the website to the Jewish National Fund; likewise, if you make a purchase, we receive a rebate.

Finally, please mark Saturday evening, Nov. 15, on your calendar: It's Casino Night. There will be games of chance, prizes, food and drink; you'll have a great time. We are still wanting for prizes; please donate anything new that you can. Also, please ask your local restaurant, hairstylist, nail salon or any other concern you frequent for a gift card or certificate that we can use as prizes. We will be glad to supply you with letters and fliers as needed. So please get your reservations in early, as this truly should be a fun and unforgettable evening.

Finally, on behalf of myself and Sandy, as well as the Board of Trustees, I wish our entire JCCP/CBT family a sweet, healthy and prosperous New Year.

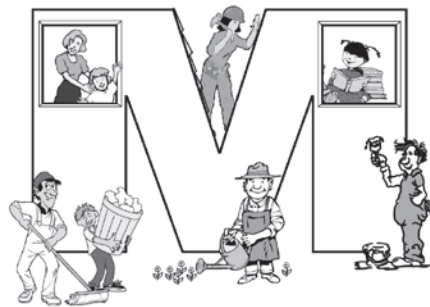

APPLE CAKE FOR THE HOLIDAYS

Ingredients:

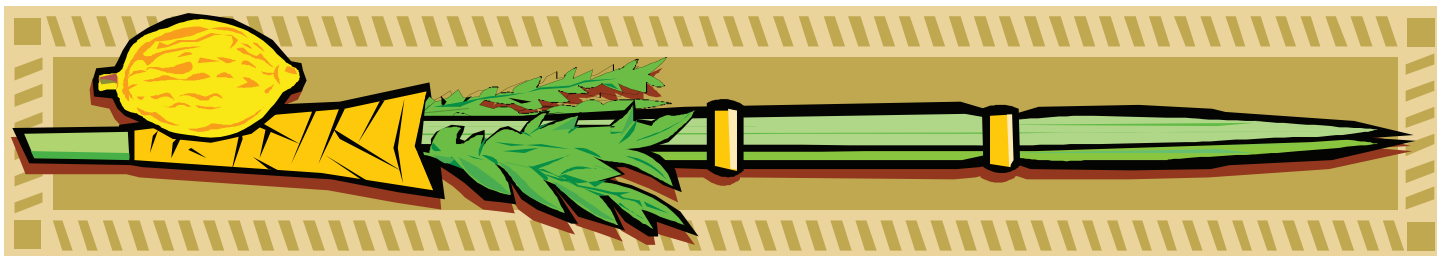
- 2 cups diced apples
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1 well-beaten egg
- 1 cup all-purpose baking flour
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 3/4 cup walnuts chopped well (optional)

Preparation:

Mix sugar and apples together and leave in bowl for 40 minutes. Then add the egg and the oil.

Sift flour, salt, baking soda, and cinnamon and slowly add to the apple mix. Last, add the vanilla and optional walnuts.

Spray an 8-inch square pan with no-stick spray. Pour in mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for about 45 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.

Your *Lulavim* and *Etrogim* will be ready for pickup on Tuesday, October 7.

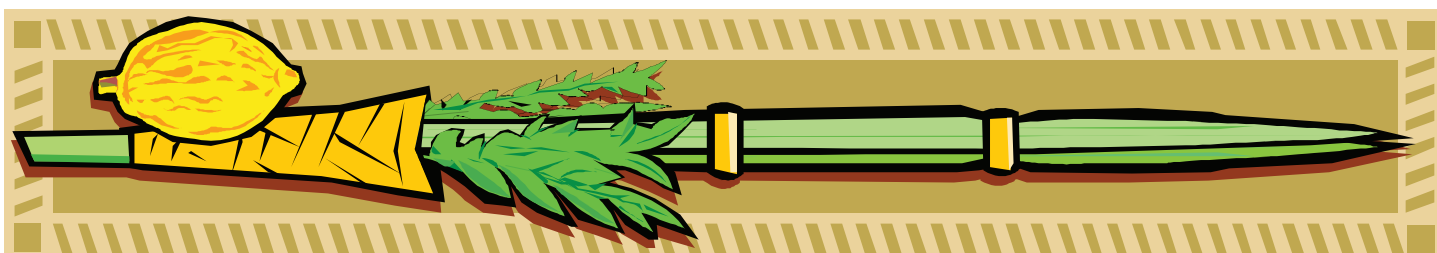

Every Day is Mitzvah Day

Our first Mitzvah of the year will be **Operation Isaiah**, the communitywide collection of food on Kol Nidre eve, Friday, October 3. Ken and Phyllis Glatzer will again be chairing this effort. JCCP/CBT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MINUTES

June 19, 2014

GOOD AND WELFARE

- Harlan Cohen thanked everyone who came to installation, for the card and good wishes, and for the cake tonight.
- Jack Bauer thanked Harlan for his service the past 2 years, and for 9 years of working together in a gentlemanly fashion.
- Arthur thanked Harlan for being one of the pillars in forming the merger, and for personally making sure every promise given as part of the merger was fulfilled.
- Shel Schmidt thanked the board members who are not returning for their years of service.
- Beth Chananie reported that Sue and Bruce Kaminer's daughter Jamie received her PhD in psychobiology, and will be working on research for Parkinson's disease.
- Roger Rosenstein reported that his daughter Hilary finished her family medicine residency at Einstein.
- Harlan announced that Bob Nesoff, a past president of New Milford, has stepped down from the board. After consulting with our parliamentarian and with the help of Jack, Arnie and Arthur, this position will be filled by Paul Duboff. Shel Schmidt – **MOTION** – to appoint Paul Duboff as the replacement of Bob Nesoff. **Second:** Roz Gerard
Vote: Unanimous
- Harlan announced with much sadness that former president Steve Charatz and his wife, Sandy, have resigned from our synagogue. He thanked them for their years of dedication to the synagogue and hoped they would reconsider their decision and rejoin us soon.

OPEN COMMENT PERIOD FROM MEMBERS

- Harriet Weinberg commented that the merger is a process, and is grateful to see that the "birthday gram" program is underway. She would like to see us develop a membership directory, similar to what they had at CBT, where members could decide what, if any, personal information they want included in the book. Debbie Zeiler offered to work on the book with the Youth group.
- David Spiegel reported that for July 4th, we are selling raffle tickets for a chance to win a new grill, plus other prizes. The funds are not there for the BBQ food, and David would like to keep his promise not to charge for this event. We need everyone's participation in purchasing raffle tickets. This year, the BBQ will be held in the evening, not following the parade, and lead into Kabbalat Shabbat.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- Harvey distributed a membership report. Marissa Rosenzweig suggested that we have an exit interview strategy, especially

for people like the Charatzes. Mimi Alpert suggested we send a thank you note to those who leave, as they may come for yahrtzeit or give donations. Rabbi Weiner reported that most members who leave do get a letter and/or phone call.

- WiFi is being installed throughout the building and should be completed around July 15.
- Palisades is in the process of moving out, and the summer tenant (Bergen County Department of Children and Families) is moving in soon. They will be here Monday through Friday for 6-8 weeks.
- Over the past 5 years, there has been litigation regarding installation of cell phone towers across the street, in the church parking lot or the ambulance corps. On June 26, there will be a meeting at the Paramus Municipal Building regarding this matter, which we can attend if there are any concerns or objections. Harlan reported that he received a letter 2 weeks ago reporting that a federal judge has ordered the Paramus Zoning Board to hold a meeting where it approves the joint application filed by Sprint and T-Mobile. So our objections may not make a difference.
- As part of our dues packet in July, we will be including a census so we can update the information in our database. We will request that congregants share what they do professionally, and we will ask if they want to be included in the membership directory.
- Mimi reported that the lighting of the stained glass windows will be addressed and corrected. Mimi thanked Laurie Rosman, who worked tirelessly to ensure that the windows were installed by the Dinner Dance.
- Rob reported that Federation has distributed a survey to get a more accurate feel for demographics in our area. It is important for everyone to participate.

CASINO COMMITTEE

- Howie Leopold announced that Casino Night is on November 15. We need items or services for the auction, and gift certificates from any businesses you frequent.

ROOF

- Harvey distributed a report explaining our roof options, which are either to repair or remediate. Discussion was tabled until Harvey gets competitive bids for a full re-roof. Wayne Zeiler suggested that Harvey detail the costs of NOT replacing the roof (i.e. replacing gym floor because of leaks, loss of rental income if gym is not usable, etc.). Gary Hutmacher suggested calling Stan Liebowitz.

REAL ESTATE UPDATE

- Tom Heisler reported that the “for sale” signs out front attracted the bottom feeders and nothing concrete came through. Hiring interviews have begun and we will be bring in a professional real estate agent.
- Harlan reported that another opportunity has arisen – a Korean church from Leonia is interested in our property, and also interested in renting our space on Sundays.
- Harlan reported that Jeff Kolodkin continues to market our space. We have a good lead, Kiddie Academy, which is interested in a 12- to 15-year lease at \$250,000 a year. However, we would need to do major renovations to bring the downstairs space up to ADA standards, as the rental requires that we have ramps, bathroom accessibility etc. Harvey will meet with Jeff to discuss what type of renovating we would need to do to make it a suitable space. It may be worthwhile in the long run to invest in these renovations.

USHERING/SHIVA SCHEDULES

- Esther Marks distributed new schedules outlining shifts for ushering and shiva duty. Rita in the office is now in charge of these schedules, so please forward any scheduling changes to her. The shiva schedules are now 2-week shifts, whereas in the past they were only 1 week.
- Alan Jay distributed a sign-up sheet for volunteers to usher on holidays throughout the year. Alan added that when there is a simcha, we will start the 2 services separately at 9 a.m., so it is important that we have 2 minyanim on these occasions.

Ushers need to arrive before 9 a.m., especially when there is a simcha.

DINNER DANCE

- Mimi reported that we will have about 200 people attending the Dinner Dance. We are expecting to bring in close to our budgeted amount.

YOUTH COMMITTEE

- Our USY adviser, Gabe Cohen, is planning to go to Israel next year, so we are looking for a successor.
- Our USY region, Hagalil, has awarded us the right to host a USY regional convention here on November 21. We will be asking for people to open their homes for the attendees to have a place to stay.

FINANCIAL AND BUDGET (FAB) TASK FORCE

- Wayne reported that the committee is working on a vision statement. We continue to look at fundraising options. We want to start a legacy program here, and contacted the chair at Federation for help – David Goodman is the contact. For continued cost savings, Harvey is looking at contracts as they expire. We are developing a prototype for a central purchasing program.

CLOSED SESSION

The topics discussed during Closed Session are confidential and will not be included in these minutes.

- Monday afternoons at 1:30, Al Nahum leads a lively discussion in his “Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow” meeting.
- On Thursday afternoons from 1:30 to 3:30, one can enjoy a weekly game of mah-jongg. All levels are welcome and there is always a coach available.
- The Book Club meets every six to eight weeks with provocative discussion on outstanding books.

We invite and welcome everyone to participate in any or all of these social activities. Throughout the year, the JCCP/CBT offers so many programs to its members. To name just a few: monthly Shabbat dinners, Casino Night, Bingo Night, adult education offerings. There is certainly something for each of you.
