**Eli and Tina Murad** are longtime synagogue members who are very involved in the religious life of the JCCP/CBT. We are delighted to honor them on Selichot for their service and contributions to our synagogue.

Eliahou Murad was born in Baghdad, Iraq, where he lived until he was 15 years old. Eli studied Hebrew with an afterschool tutor. "My bar mitzvah year was the darkest year for Iraqi Jews," he recalls. "When the defeated Iraqi army came back after the 1948 Arab-Israeli War, the Iraqi government put a number of Jews in jail and some of them were hanged in the street of Baghdad as Israeli spies. So my bar mitzvah was very simple."

When the political situation in Iraq made things even more difficult for his family, they moved to Israel, where Eli finished high school and then served in the Israel

Defense Forces and the Navy. After finishing his service, he enrolled in the prestigious Technion-Israel Institute of Technology, where he studied civil engineering. He worked for 17 years as an engineer, 13 in Israel and four in Tehran, the capital of Iran.

Tina Ezrapour was born in Tehran. Her parents sent her to the United States to study; she attended the University of Connecticut. In 1963 she traveled to Israel to meet her parents, who were visiting family. Tina and Eli met at a wedding, quickly fell in love and were married within a month after meeting. Their three children – Jacob, Anat and Ronen – were born in Israel: Jacob in 1964, Anat in 1968 and Ronen in 1973. In 1974 Eli and Tina moved to Iran to be near Tina's parents, who still were living in Tehran. Eli worked for an Israeli company that was doing some building for the Iran Navy.

In 1978, Tina and Eli came to the United States to visit Eli's family, which had emigrated. While in America, the political situation with the shah worsened to the point where Tina's parents told them not to return to Iran. Tina and Eli moved to Paramus and joined the JCCP in 1978. Eli and Tina became partners with Eli's brother, Menashe, in Seventh Avenue Stationers in New York City, a stationery and art supply store that was geared to the fashion industry. In 1995 Eli's brother opened a store that sold specialty pens, while Tina and Eli continued as owners of Seventh Avenue Stationers until 2013 when they retired. They sold their business to JCCP/CBT member Gershon Rosenzweig.

Anat and Ronen Murad attended our Hebrew school and celebrated their b'nai mitzvahs in the shul. Tina's parents, the late Violet and Salim Ezrapour, immigrated to the United States in 1986. (They wanted to leave Iran sooner but were unable to because of the revolution.) They moved to Paramus and joined the JCCP/CBT, where they were members until their deaths. Eli has three brothers and two sisters who live in the U.S. His brother Fred passed away in 1993. Tina has two brothers: Fouad Ezrapour lives in Cincinnati, Ohio, with his wife, Mary, and Allen Ezrapour lives with his wife, Ruth, and their three children in Teaneck. Tina's sister Linda lives in Paramus.

Jacob and his wife, Tamara, live with their children Ethan, 18, and Lexi 15, in Teaneck. Anat and her husband, Gregg Levey, live in Falmouth, Maine, with their children Kaya, 10, and Aden, 8. Sadly, Ronen passed away in 2004.

Both Tina and Eli are multilingual: Eli speaks English, Hebrew and Arabic, and Tina speaks five languages: Hebrew, English, Arabic, Farsi and French.

Eli is at the JCCP/CBT almost daily. He is a regular at the morning minyan, is active in the Men's Club, and regularly participates in both the traditional and egalitarian services, where he reads Torah and does the haftorah. Tina reads Torah and leads parts of the egalitarian service. She often attends Sisterhood events and they both attend holiday services. They have many good friends at the JCCP/CBT and consider the synagogue to be an important part of their lives.

## From the Rabbi

Are we wise enough to change our minds?

The High Holidays are about renewing our bonds to our Jewish community and our Jewish heritage. They challenge us to think about and, if necessary, changing our life's direction, our thought process, our habits and our behaviors. They are about change in both small ways and large ways for the purpose of making a better life for ourselves and to improve the world. The High Holidays are a testament to one of the greatest and most original ideas that Judaism shared with the world: That we are capable of change. We have free will, and we have both the potential and opportunity to do great things with our choices. Change is hard, but the High Holidays remind us that it is possible.

My life experiences and career in the rabbinate have taught me that among the types of change that one can experience, the ability to change our minds may be the most difficult. The way we think about things and frame situations is based on many factors. Sometimes it is the lessons of yesterday; sometimes our decision-making is influenced by events from our childhood. There are psychologists who believe that some of our decision-making processes are also influenced by evolution, and they prove this by demonstrating how people living in different places throughout the world will

respond similarly in various situations. Yet Jewish tradition makes the bold claim that we are capable of changing our minds as well.

How might we accomplish this feat in the coming year? Perhaps the words of Benjamin Franklin, as our Founding Fathers debated the meaning of the Constitution in Philadelphia in 1787, offer insight:

*"... Mr. President, I confess that there are several parts of the Constitution that I do not at present approve, but I am not sure that I will never approve them. For having lived long, I have experienced many instances of being obliged by better information, or fuller consideration, to change opinions even on important subjects, which I once thought right, but found to be otherwise. It is therefore that the older I grow, the more apt I am to doubt my own judgment and to pay more respect to the judgment of others."*

We would all do well to listen carefully to Mr. Franklin's words, as true today as they were when spoken in 1787. Let them be an inspiration for all, so that we may be motivated to achieve our desire to change for the better in the New Year that rapidly approaches.

## President's Message

It is hard to believe that the High Holidays are about to commence again.

To start, I want to send a Mazel Tov to Tina and Eli Murad on being selected as our Selichot honorees this year; it's an honor well deserved.

During the past year, the following major improvements were made to the building:

- New roof
- Energy efficient lighting was installed
- A new air conditioner was installed in the gym

- New boilers were installed

The improvements should result in major energy cost savings for the congregation.

The work toward the sale of our Midland Avenue properties continues to go forward. The proposed buyer has completed all the mandatory studies and is awaiting final approval from Paramus so we can finalize the transaction.

Our new executive director, Norman Levin, started in late June and is doing a fantastic job in running our building and tending to the myriad decisions he must make on a constant basis. If you have not introduced yourselves to him, please stop by his office. It is always open.

More than ever we need your support:

The major strength of our existence throughout our history has been our daily minyans. In the past year there have been many times when we were unable to hold a service because we did not have enough attendees. If at all possible, please make an effort to join the minyan, either morning or evening, at least once a week.

Of course we need your continued financial support. We are negotiating with a potential tenant for our school facility, but even if this comes to fruition, it will only result in approximately a 50% reduction in our expected deficit for the coming year. We are implementing cost reduction measures wherever possible and will continue to strive to find more. But we need your financial support.

Here are some ways you can provide that support without actually giving money:

### • Everyone Eats!!!

Everyone Eats" is the name of our supermarket scrip program. There is NO COST TO YOU to participate, yet our congregation benefits every time you do. We make it easy: Just tell us what you want and we will deliver the scrip to your door once a month. Scrip is available from ShopRite, Stop & Shop, Fairway, A&P, Pathmark and Harold's. Questions? Please call either Esther Marks at (201) 261-7499 or Fred Harris at (201) 444-2352.

- If you have a TD Bank account, register your account in their Af-

finity Program. We receive \$10 for every account that is registered plus a dividend on your balances. To register an account, just visit a TD branch and tell them you wish to join its Affinity Program with the JCCP/CBT. Furthermore, any account can be cross-referenced and can come from anywhere – friends, businesses, etc. In the past year we received nearly \$1,000 from this program. The bank compiles the amounts and it just sends us a check.

- If you make a purchase from Amazon, please sign on through our Amazon link on the JCCP/CBT web page and we will receive an incentive from Amazon for your purchases.
- You may have a skill that could save us money. We always have needs throughout the building that cost us. Please let us know if you are willing to volunteer to make repairs or help in the office – let us know your specialty.

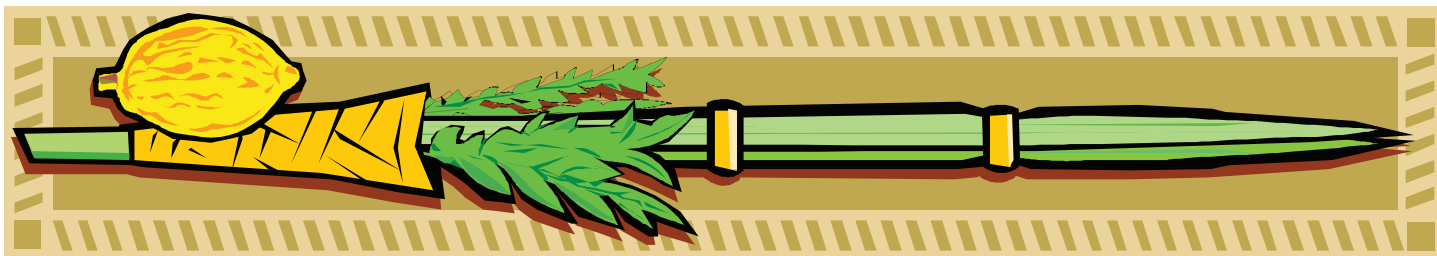

Your *Lulavim* and *Etrogim* will be ready for pickup on Sunday, September 27.

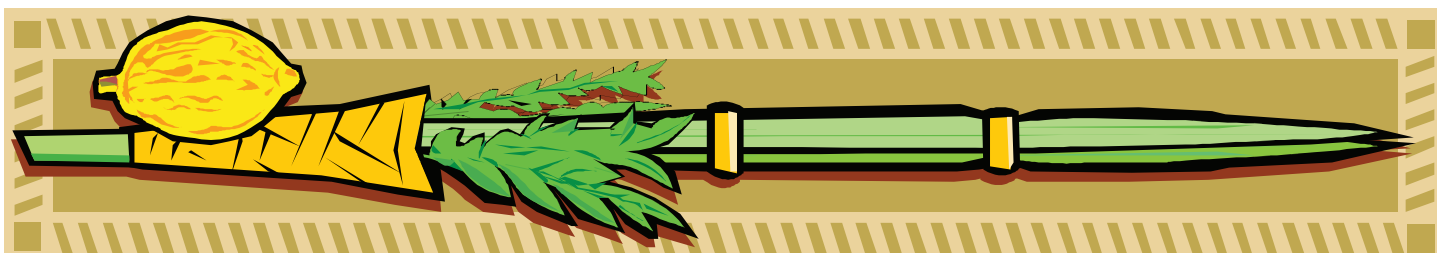

Here are two simple recipes for side dishes...

### HONEYED CARROTS

Serves 6

#### Ingredients:

4 cups cooked carrots (can slice large ones or use the baby carrots – just don't overcook)  
2 tablespoons low-fat margarine  
3 tablespoons orange juice  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/4 teaspoon ginger  
4 tablespoons honey  
vegetable spray (like Pam)

#### Preparation:

Combine all the ingredients in a saucepan (sprayed with vegetable spray) and over a low flame, cook covered for about 15 minutes. Don't forget to stir now and then.



### EGG BARLEY AND MUSHROOMS

#### Ingredients:

1/2 pound egg barley (cooked and drained according to directions)  
3 stalks celery finely diced  
2 onions finely diced  
3 tablespoons olive oil  
1/2 cup sliced fresh (or canned) mushrooms  
1-1 1/2 cups chicken or vegetable broth  
salt and pepper to taste

#### Preparation:

Saute onion and celery and mushrooms in olive oil. Add barley and season with salt and pepper. Bake in oven for 20 minutes with added broth for added moisture.

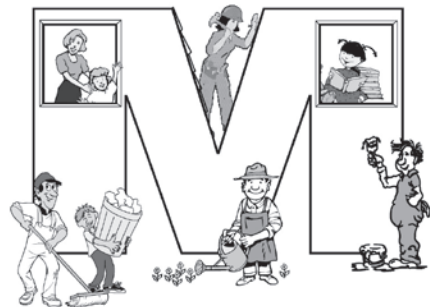

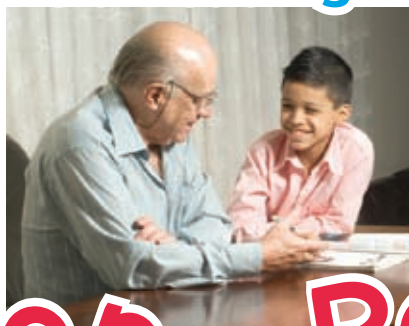

## Sharing Our Simchas

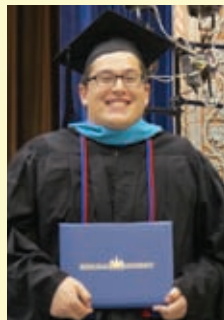

## **JEWISH HISTORICAL SOCIETY**

For the past 18 months, the Jewish Historical Society of North Jersey has looked at dozens of properties in search of a suitable new home, where we can store the "treasure chest" of local Jewish history collected over a 35-year period. We will soon be closing on an office condominium on River Road in Fair Lawn with room to store our entire collection. We envision having two exhibit areas on permanent display; a historical timeline; a resource center for visitors and scholars; and a space where schoolchildren can learn of our (and their) history. There will also be a work room for volunteers, an archivist's office and a reception area.

Although our nomadic existence is nearly over, our need for financial help continues. We still need to pay for a moving company, some renovations, furniture, furnishings and equipment. We would also like to increase the hours of our part-time archivist and perhaps hire a part-time executive director. Only after that can we truly achieve the dream of a Jewish museum and resource center for North Jersey.

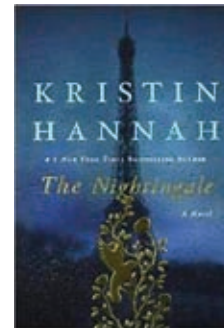
