Garin Tzabar, a program run by the Friends of the Israel Scouts (Tzofim) was founded in 1991. Garin, a Hebrew word for "core" or "seed," is a term used in Israel for soldiers who choose to experience their army service together as a social unit of mutual support and camaraderie. The members of Garin Tzabar, a group formed for Diaspora Jews and children of Israelis who choose to move to Israel and serve in the Israel Defense Forces, are adopted by the Israel Scouts and placed in a hosting kibbutz that quickly becomes their home away from home throughout the duration of their army service.

On Friday, June 15, we are happy to host Einav Zamir, director of Garin Tzabar, and

Dani Tenenbaum, liaison to Tzofim Garin Tzabar, who will lead an informative presentation on the program. We are honored to have with us that evening members of Garin Tzabar and their families, including Sharon Tzarfati (from Cresskill) and Ilana Rosenzweig (from our own JCCP), who will be leaving for Israel in August and volunteering for the IDF. They will share with us the motivation that brought them to this decision. We will also hear from a graduate of Garin Tzabar, as well as a Hanna Ben-Shoan, mother of Yahav (also a member of our JCCP), who is serving in the IDF, and her sister Tzlil, a Garin Tzabar graduate.

From the Rabbi

As I write for this month's column, I am in Atlanta, Ga., attending the annual convention of the Rabbinical Assembly, the international professional organization of Conservative rabbis.

Over the past 23 years I have attended 20 such conventions. In earlier years most were held at the old Concord Hotel (of blessed memory), yet over the past generation, following the spread of the movement throughout the country, Europe, South America, and Israel, the convention has been held throughout the United States and Israel.

I enjoy these conventions and always feel that I take away something of value from them. But what has been most interesting to me of late has been to compare the concerns and issues that are on our agenda now as opposed to those of 10 to 15 years ago. The changing nature of our discussions gives a real insight to the profound shifts that have occurred in American Judaism in general and the Conservative movement in particular in recent years.

Israel is a topic of concern at the convention this year. But the conversation about Israel is not dominated by Iran's nuclear ambitions, or whether President Obama is or is not reliable on Israel, but rather redefining and reinventing our

own personal relationship with Israel. As Israel, despite its many problems and pressures (unique among the nations of the world — let's never forget that) has grown, changed, and matured, it is worth asking: Has American Jewry's relationship with Israel undergone a similar transformation. Israel once was poor, beleaguered, and threatened with extinction. Now, while significant challenges and risks still are a part of her reality, Israel is no longer poor, and it possesses (thank God!) the most powerful military in the region by far. So how do we identify with Israel when Israel has changed, we have changed, our expectations have changed, our own Jewish identity has changed, and when support for Israel means something different today that it did even a few years ago? These are some of the issues that important and visionary thinkers and speakers from both Israel and the Diaspora discussed with us, and I look forward to sharing some of their ideas with the congregation in the near future.

The issue of intermarriage and outreach was another big topic of conversation and debate. The changing face of religious meaning, commitment, and identity in America has led to a different set of assumptions than those of a generation ago. As Jews have become full participants in every aspect of American life and society, barriers that once separated Jews from non-Jews have all but disappeared. The dreams of our parents and grandparents have truly been realized. But they have had an impact on both the decisions of the lay community, as well as the Rabbinic leadership. What are our limits? What is the proper language we should use when addressing these issues? Is it possible to be welcoming even as we attempt to maintain faith with a tradition rooted in a reality far different than our current situation?

Only in what on the High Holidays I called the "courageous conversation," where we create the conditions for honest and critical thinking, can these challenges be addressed and then resolved in a manner that truly improves the condition of Judaism and enriches the lives of individual Jews and the members of their families. I am confident that our deliberations will have a great impact as we continue to grapple with issues.

I believe with all my heart that the future of American Jewry is intimately connected to the strength and welfare of Conservative Judaism. With all due respect to the many successes and contributions of the Reform, Orthodox and other approaches to Judaism, we continue to make contributions that inspire the lives of many and exert influence on all Jewish life. Most of the innovations in Jewish

life that we take for granted today, whether Bat Mitzvah ceremonies for young women or religious-based Zionism, grew out of the Conservative movement and then entered the mainstream. Whether in Israel, Europe or other places in the world where the Conservative movement's influence is weak, the condition of Judaism in general is weak. But in North and South America, where the Conservative movement is stronger and more influential, the condition of all three movements is stronger, providing benefits for all.

I am confident that this convention will help rabbis throughout the world lead and teach their communities in new and creative ways. I look forward to many opportunities to share the conversations and exchanges of ideas that took place in Atlanta with the community.

Over the past two years we have improved the lighting in the gym and sanctuary; replaced three very old air conditioners; repaired and repainted the sanctuary; created a committee to establish an Endowments and Legacy program, starting with a well-attended breakfast in May with a wonderful speaker hosted by Sisterhood and Men's Club; enjoyed several successful events, including the Maccabeats concert and an Art Auction; and established the Israel Awareness Committee. And with no budget, we put together several successful events; offered a unique collaborative program with the Y, with reduced membership fees to JCCP congregants; and expanded our egalitarian services to include the High Holidays beginning this year.

While this is all well and good, there is much more that needs to be done. New and innovative programming needs to continue year-round, much-needed new prayer books need to be chosen, ordered and paid for, and repairs and improvements need to be made at all of our properties. More needs to be done to attract new and young families. A new strategic study needs to be done to determine our needs in the future. Some of this may very well be accomplished by revising and updating our Memorials and Dedications Program; this effort will be spearheaded by Gershon Rosenzweig and Larry Rosman.

Your incoming president, Harlan Cohen, and his executive team will need your full support, your ideas, and your time. Together, we can continue to improve our synagogue and make it even better, and the first place a new Jewish family to our area will choose.

Thank you for your patience, trust, and understanding. It was an honor to serve you all over the past two years.

From the Executive Director

I'd like to remind you of a few programs that the JCCP has in place allowing you to help the synagogue earn money to defray its costs — and they won't cost you a cent!

One program helps the JCCP and United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism earn a donation from the Jewish National Fund. On the JCCP website, on the upper right corner of the homepage, you will see a box that says "Donate While Shopping Online." If you click on that box, it takes you to a page

where you can donate to the JNF. Scroll down that page to find a JNF box that you can click on and go to the JNF website and buy trees or items from the JNF store, or just make donations to JNF. By making your purchase through our website rather than directly through the JNF site, JNF will donate 20% back to the JCCP and another 5% to USCJ to support congregational Israel programs. It's a triple mitzvah! You support Israel, the JCCP, and United Synagogue with one purchase.

We have set up a similar program, designed for non-profit organizations, with Amazon.com. Amazon will also donate funds back to the JCCP for purchases made through an Amazon link/banner on the homepage of the JCCP website. The Amazon link can be found either on the bottom left hand side of the JCCP homepage, or follow the instructions above and find the Amazon link under "Donate While Shopping Online." You will be able to make purchases using your current Amazon account or you can create a new one. By clicking on the Amazon link on the JCCP website, the synagogue will

get credit for your purchases and Amazon will periodically send us a donation check based on those purchases. In the last six months, the JCCP has received \$624 from Amazon, or about \$100 per month, based on the purchases our congregants have made on Amazon. We will not see your purchases or any personal information. We just receive a check!

Finally, I want to take this opportunity to remind you that the JCCP Office accepts credit cards as a way to pay your synagogue obligations. In order to defray any additional cost to the synagogue, a convenience charge will be added to every transaction. Of course, we still accept cash and checks, too!

Early Childhood Center News

The ECC has snapped, crackled and popped during these last few months of the school year! The weeks since we returned after Pesach have been packed with events, activities, and excitement.

While some of the spring festivals are not relevant to young children, several are. We celebrated Israel's 64th birthday with, what else ... a cake! Older children made flags, younger children made collages in blue and white, and we sang songs and used Hebrew a little more than usual. And this is a year when Shavuot falls before the end of school, so we have the opportunity to teach about it. We begin by going back to the story of Pesach and then ask the question, "So what do you think happened next?" The experience of wandering, hungry and thirsty, in the hot, sandy desert can be made very real to children. Certainly the concept of getting a present is real to the children! What is the ultimate gift? God's gift to us, the Torah. We'll take one of our famous field trips to the JCCP with the older children to have a look at the Torahs.

During the past two years we have run optional "afterschool" programs: age-appropriate, 45-minute classes focused on a particular subject. A "course" called Musicmakers, which features singing, dancing, rhythms, and even

making our own instruments, just ended. And Nature in Paramus has just begun! Children love to walk around our grounds and see what the environment yields — helicopter seeds, roly-polies, inchworms and earthworms. The children whose parents sign them up for these classes love the extra enrichment!

One of our major tzedakah initiatives, a very child-friendly one, took place in May. "Jumping Sacks for Tay-Sachs" is a now annual ECC event that raises money for the Cure Tay-Sachs Foundation. Our selection of this cause is personal and meaningful to the ECC community: A family in our community whose son is in the ECC lost a child to Tay-Sachs at the age of 6 a year ago. Children jump in child-sized sacks designed for the purpose, and parents and others can pledge money per jump or make a flat donation. We are grateful to several JCCP members who don't have children in the ECC but graciously supported our event and this cause with contributions. All monies aren't in yet, but last year our small school raised \$1,000 for the Cure Tay-Sachs Foundation.

A new event for ECC families was inaugurated this spring. We held our first family picnic right in the ECC yard. I am proud to say that the event was conceived by the ECC faculty, who felt that we needed to provide a simple, congenial event for families to be together. We already have one in the fall — our Sukkot dinner — and now we have a new tradition. I ordered sandwiches, people brought blankets to sit on, children played, and parents and teachers schmoozed. A good time was had by all, and a good time will be had next year!

We end the year with class parties for all ages and art shows highlighting the children's work throughout the year. We at the ECC wish everyone a happy, restful summer.





