

#### From the Desk of Rabbi Arthur D. Weiner



On the second day of Rosh Hashanah, I told a story in synagogue about the possibility of real change, which concluded with the lesson "... From what a Jew is or does this Shabbos, you can never predict what he will be or do next Shabbos." After telling the story, I explained that I was going to try to challenge each and every member of the community in the coming year by constantly referring to a set of principles — questions really — that I hope we would ask each other on a daily basis.

I believe that we are capable of change. Just as I believe in this idea, and the ability of the High Holidays season to help us along this path, I have faith and believe in your ability to change, especially in your appreciation and understanding of your Jewish heritage, your commitment to Am Yisrael, and Medinat Yisrael — to the words of the Torah, and your knowledge of God. By confronting these questions, we might better position ourselves to make change, especially with regard to enriching our Jewish identities.

So here are the questions. I would even suggest that you print them out and refer to

them often. When the answers are "yes," continue. But if the answers are "no," perhaps taking steps to change them can be the key to achieving the renewal, the transformation and the T'shuvah for which we prayed so earnestly during the High Holidays season.

Did I think about G-d and the special relationship that a Jew can achieve with him?

Did I make time for real prayer, even if it is as simple as the Shma, or a blessing before I eat?

Did my actions bring glory to G-d's name?

Even when challenged, did I make the effort to love my neighbor as myself?

Did I refrain from cheating, stealing or gossiping?

Did I perform at least one Gemilut Hasadim, one act of loving kindness, on behalf of someone else?

Did I do something to help the general condition of the Jewish people?

Did I find a way to strengthen the ability of the synagogue to further its message?

Did I help to strengthen the State of Israel?

Did I offer Tzedakah to a needy person or organization?

Change is important, but all too often we lack a plan or a direction to help us achieve it. Thus our previous efforts all too often have not met with success, leaving us frustrated and disheartened. It is my great hope that these simple ideas, as well as those you may come up with on your own, will insure a better result than in the past. I look forward to standing with you next Rosh Hashanah, taking pleasure in how far we have come.

The holidays are behind us, the school year is in full gear and so is the JCCP.



## **Early Childhood Center News**

The caprices of the Jewish and secular calendars this year have wreaked havoc with the onset of the High Holidays, the start of the school year, and everyone's mindset. Add a new Early Childhood director, some exciting new Sukkot activities, and a Bulletin publication deadline that doesn't cooperate with the holidays and I find myself writing, in early September, about activities that are expected to occur in mid-September, which you will read in early October. Since everything about these events is new to us, bear with me as I tell you about what I think is going to happen.

First, a little about Sukkot, a holiday my family is accustomed to enjoying on an extensive level. Of course, this lengthy festival celebrates the fall harvest, as well as commemorates the wandering of the Israelites in the desert. It is designed as a merry, very joyous holiday, made all the more festive because of its iuxtaposition with the solemn High Holy Days. The importance of Sukkot is emphasized by one of the ancient names for the holiday -"he-Chag," or "THE festival." Besides the lulav and the etrog, the major symbol of the festival is the harvest hut, in which we are commanded to "dwell." As an annual family event, Sukkot is easily accessible to young children.

My family has put up a sukkah since our twin sons, now young adults, were toddlers. Having guests is important to us, and when the children were little, we had company every night of the chaq. Our accumulated decorations reflect our family, and they include Indian corn and dried flowers, hangings our children

made in nursery school, tiny plastic baseball hats, a collection of bookmarks, and posters. We used to go apple picking for the express purpose of making apple crisp to serve to our guests in the sukkah, and the boys would select pumpkins and gourds at the farm stand, too. For families who wish to intensify their level of observance and invest in a fund of Jewish memories for their children, Sukkot can't be beat.

Since the ECC has its own backyard, several of the teachers told me that they wished we had our own "real" sukkah. So I posted an online request for the donation of a sukkah, and received one response — serendipitously from JCCP members Jim and Miriam Gershfield. Thanks to their generosity, the ECC will be putting up its own, family-size (same size as mine, I believe), authentic sukkah this year, and every year going forward. We plan to construct it with one side completely open to allow easy access by and easy supervision of the children. We will decorate the sukkah mostly with hangings created by the children, as well as posters and pictures. I anticipate saving some of the children's work, creating our own traditions as we re-hang them in the sukkah year after year. Classes will have snack (and maybe lunch) in the sukkah during chol hamoed, but what we really hope is that the children will use the sukkah during outdoor playtime: running in and out, making mud pies and holding tea parties, extending their play scenarios. Thus they will truly "dwell" in the sukkah on an age-appropriate, developmentally suitable level.

Another first for the ECC, this time in the JCCP communal sukkah, will be our Family Sukkot Dinner. In what we hope will become an annual event for our families, the ECC community will gather for dinner, blessings, stories, songs, and crafts. We anticipate that the evening will create fellowship as well as awareness of Sukkot and how we celebrate it with their children.

Sukkot 5771 is but a memory as you read this. Did the new ECC Sukkot activities really happen? Were new traditions created? Did it all pan out? Call me at 201-967-1334 to find out!

I hope you will all be generous and realize that the future of our synagogue depends on our ability to attract young families, and a vibrant nursery school is a major contributing factor in their decision to join a synagogue.

Bored? Look out for the Adult Ed program coming soon. And keep your eyes open for details on an upcoming fund-raising event, a Goods and Service Auction that I hope will be as much fun and as successful as the last one.


