From the Desk of Rabbi Arthur D. Weiner



Sometimes a story can reveal profound truths that can truly illuminate the human condition. The following was shared several years ago by Rabbi Joseph Telushkin, a leading thinker, author and scholar whose books include the well-known "Jewish Literacy."

"Joe Lapchick was one of the great basketball players in the pre-World War II era and played center for the legendary Celtics. When his 7-year-old son was stricken with polio, Lapchick's neighbors expressed concern for the boy's health, but the basketball star was shocked when one of them, in the presence of the sick child, asked if the boy would ever be able to play basketball again.

The next day, when he visited the hospital, Lapchick asked his son if he wanted to be a basketball player. The boy said yes, and his father told him that all he wanted was for him to have a happy and normal life, and to give something back to society.

The son eventually recovered and suffered no long-term effects from his illness. Years later, however, he still recalled the words his father had spoken to

him that day in the hospital. As the son of a great athlete, he had always imagined that he had to follow in his father's footsteps.

His father's words, which conveyed a love not conditioned on his son replicating his feats, freed the young boy from the complex that he, too, had to be a sports star.

'I recognized that my father had given me perhaps his greatest gift on that morning in Grasslands Hospital. He freed me of the need to please him and gave me the opportunity to fulfill myself.'"

In just a few days, the High Holidays will begin. They add meaning and purpose to our lives in many ways.

For some the High Holidays are a time for gathering the family and friends and to renew the ties that bind us together. For others, the comfort and familiarity that the prayers, the melodies, even the seats that you and your family have sat in for years, provide an opportunity to connect with our faith and our community. Others will experience Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur as religious obligations to be fulfilled and have the satisfaction that comes from fulfilling our religious responsibilities.

Of course, most of us will experience many of these possibilities simultaneously, for they serve our needs on many levels.

But one aspect of the High Holidays that must be confronted is the chance to do things differently, to get it right, to free ourselves from the way that others want us to be and attempt to live our lives the

way that we wish. It is not about avoiding responsibility to our family or community. Yet Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur remind us about our basic responsibility to ourselves.

This year, I want to challenge each member of the community to learn the lesson that Rabbi Telushkin is trying to teach us with his message. This year, while celebrating the High Holidays, I urge you to see this as an opportunity to really ask yourself: What is my responsibility to myself? Not to avoid our responsibilities to others or to our Jewish community or to Israel, or the world around us. But rather

to engage in an intimate conversation — just God and you — of your needs, your fears, your dreams, in order to plot a course for a better future.

As a Jewish community, we are so completely devoted to the safety and security of others (which is particularly necessary at this point in Jewish history) that we run the risk of avoiding the hard and penetrating questions to the individual that are at the heart of the High Holidays experience. Let this be the year that we accept the challenge, and enjoy the transformation and possibilities that will follow.

L'shana Tovah — A happy and healthy New Year to all.

Join Cantor Weiss for '100 Voices' Screening on Sept. 21

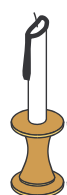

Shalom and Welcome to a New Year at the JCCP Hebrew School!

Rooms are ready, books have been delivered, and our teachers are ready to begin.

A full, exciting year is planned in the Hebrew School: family events, school trips, special visiting programs, School on Shabbat, and holiday celebrations for all.

This year is unusual in that Rosh Hashanah will be celebrated before Hebrew School begins. As always, children's programs will be offered on both days of Rosh Hashanah from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., and on Yom Kippur from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Children up to eighth grade will have a place to be and activities to engage in. Please be sure to take advantage of this outstanding program, which is designed to keep the children appropriately entertained and allow the parents to attend their own services.

School will begin on Sunday, Sept. 12, with an assembly at 9:30 a.m. in the sanctuary. When the children go to class to meet their teachers, there will be light refreshments for the parents, allowing them time to become acquainted. FYI, Entertainment Books will be available for purchase this year from APT. I hope that many center members will participate in this fund-raiser. Each book costs \$30; APT will receive \$15 of this to be used to bring special programs to the children in the Hebrew School. The Annual Opening Breakfast will be held two weeks later, on Sunday, Sept. 26, during the holiday of Sukkot. Parents can fulfill the mitzvot of eating in the sukkah and shaking the lulav and etrog. Explanations and directions will be available for all, so don't be shy! The children also will have the opportunity to perform these two mitzvot with their teachers.

President's Message

I am proud to be representing our synagogue as your new president. Before I began the vice-president cycle, I served for nearly 14 years as your treasurer. Throughout those years of service, I met and worked with many members and was always deeply touched and affected by our synagogue's spirit and passion. Whatever the issue or how deeply divided people felt about something, there was always a strong determination to work together to find a common denominator or solution.

This characteristic hopefully will serve us well in the coming years as we face a host of new problems together. It should come as no surprise that as our membership ages, the synagogue dynamic evolves: a reduction in our revenue stream, an increase in health issues relating to aging, more demands on maintaining an aging physical plant, including our main building, Early Childhood Center and the caretaker's house, as well as both rabbis' homes.

Burying our heads in the sand will not make any of our problems go away. It will take our collective brains and the best of our ideas and creativity to find new solutions to all of our issues. I encourage and urge all of you to participate and work with us, to help your officers with the problems we all face together.

I spoke with one member on the phone a few months ago and asked her why she didn't come to the synagogue more

frequently. She replied that there was not enough going on. I thought about it for a moment and realized that although I disagreed with her, it was her perception and it was probably shared by others. This is a perception we need to correct.

Since I took office last month, we have celebrated with an enthusiastic prelude to the summer at the Lag b'Omer picnic in Van Saun Park, threw a fabulous farewell event for Paula Javits, our long-serving Early Childhood Center director, had our always festive Dinner Dance, this year honoring the Jays and Rosenzweigs, and the Fourth of July Picnic. Not to mention many other weekly activities, such as the lively Adult Ed classes, reinvigorated by Mark Topel and Rabbi Weiner.

I hope in the coming months to introduce new events, so the false perception of a stale and staid synagogue community life is upended and drasti-

cally revisited by the "seldom-seen-ers." More speakers and musical events, appealing to the young and old, art auctions, perhaps another Casino Night, a Burn the Mortgage celebration, yoga, widow and widowers social networking, JDate subscriptions for our post-college kids and perhaps a traveling card game for men and women.

In our own homes, we are the problem solvers in our day-to-day lives. We all need to act the same way in our "second home." I encourage you all to reach out to me with your ideas and suggestions. Meanwhile, I hope that instead of dwelling on the problems we face that we can also appreciate the beauty of our Judaism and celebrate its richness, history, and diversity together. We are and should be bursting with life; we should be able to enjoy it every day. I hope we can continue to make our synagogue an important part of that dynamic.

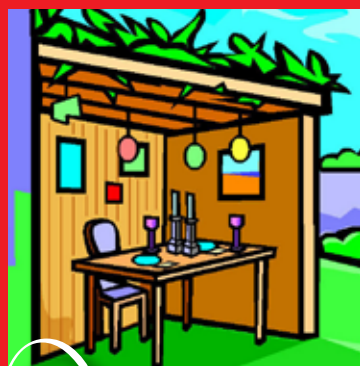

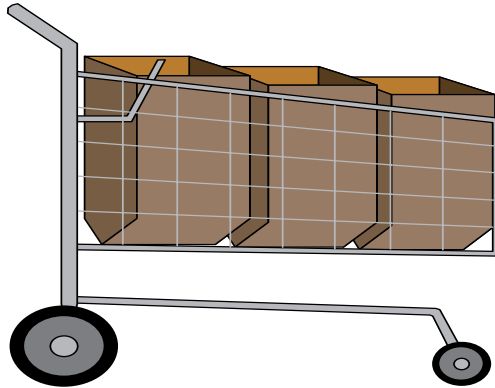
