

From the Rabbi

Each year, during the Musaf service of the High Holidays, we are challenged to consider our lives. We fervently pray the famous lines *"On Rosh Hashanah it is written, and on Yom Kippur it is sealed ..."*

After the powerful imagery of this liturgy has been ingrained in us, we are reminded that our fate actually is not settled and there is still room for human action. In fact, far from a determinist view, the point of this liturgy is to remind us that there is much we can do to make our own luck, forge our own path, and take action that can have a significant impact on the upcoming year. In fact, we are told that ...

Teshuvah (Repentance), Tefilah (Prayer) and Tzedakah (Righteousness) will make all the difference in the new year.

I mention this in my October Bulletin article because each year I experience a certain "letdown" after the High Holidays. I must tell you that I love seeing our entire congregation gathered in its largest numbers of the year. I love the promise and potential of the High Holidays, and the strength, hope, and security I feel when I see our community joined in celebration of our holiest time of the year. I love catching up with those I have known for years but may not have seen recently. But I also know that we cannot maintain the focus and intensity of the High Holidays period all year long any more than a college student can work with the same diligence and energy during the regular semester year as he or

she can muster during the week of final exams or, for that matter, a baseball fan regarding a regular-season game as opposed to the excitement of the World Series.

Yet these powerful ideas must not be reserved just for the High Holidays. They can and must be part of our religious vocabulary and vision at all times. Is there a way to achieve this?

Rabbi Menachem Mendel Morgenstern, known as the Kotzker Rebbe one of the greatest and most influential rabbis and teachers of the 19th century – once professed to his disciples that "when I was young, I desired to change the world. But I quickly realized that this was an impossible feat, so I decided to work on my city alone. This, too, became unachievable, so I focused solely on my family. But I now finally realize that the only person I can truly change is myself."

I want you to truly understand what the Rebbe was teaching his community, for I am trying to share the same message. Rabbi Morgenstern was not abandoning his quest to change the world or his responsibility to be at the forefront of that change. After all, he never ceased to lead his thousands of followers with conviction and determination. Rather, he was reminding them of the one the great truths that we affirmed with our participation in the Rosh Hashanah service yet somehow must renew each day: that real change must begin from within. And Judaism teaches us how to begin that process.

- **Teshuvah (Repentance):** an awareness that change can be initiated and realized at any time if we are courageous enough to take those first difficult steps.
- **Tefilah (Prayer):** Prayer and other religious observances can help and sustain us as we venture in new and uncharted areas, linking us to others in our community who similarly wish to allow their Judaism to help strengthen them as they move from one small step on their journey to the next.
- **Tzedakah (Righteousness):** This value represents all the values that

our ancestors lived by and aspired to – a society in which all are cared for and have food to eat, clothing to wear, and lodging to shelter them. Yet we must be creators of this better reality. As the leading scholar Rabbi Dov Peretz Elkins once wrote, "... This glorious ideal can rise above the human's worst fear – that life ends and we are no more. But Tzedakah keeps us alive, because the human spirit is indestructible and eternal." Good, moral, and positive behavior and

activity grounds us and gives us the best opportunity to put into practice our great ideas and hope.

The High Holidays are behind us. Now, as we transition to our daily routines, the real test of our High Holidays hopes and dreams is before us. May we use these three ideas to make the changes that will bring the peace and serenity that each of us deserves, and make the possibilities of the High Holidays season a reality.

From the Executive Director

Last year, I wrote that in Talmud, Rosh Hashanah, it states, "Who changes his place changes his luck!"

We've certainly had a full year of change, indeed.

We're coming off a very successful "first year" of our merged kehillah. Signs of the integration of the two congregations into one cohesive, stronger community are visible everywhere. From our minyanim and worship services, to our PT Singers, from our mah jongg afternoons to our Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow group, signs of renewed vigor and larger numbers are visible everywhere.

Physically, we have installed all the New Milford Jewish Center/ Congregation Beth Tikvah memorial plaques in a place of honor in the sanctuary and repurposed the magnificent stained glass windows of the former CBT building in our Social Hall, creating an eye-catching focal point for the room.

We've upgraded our computer systems and added WiFi capability throughout the entire building, thus enhancing our member/guest experience when inside the

building and improving connectivity and functionality.

We've begun to implement and install new security equipment and protocols consistent with a changing world. Many are unseen except to the trained eye, but nevertheless are in place and functioning. Several more will be added over the next few months as we spend the Homeland Security grant we were awarded last fall.

As I noted, we will be experimenting and challenging ourselves to try new and different approaches to solve age-old synagogue problems. Few aspects of shul life will be exempted from inspection, discussion and review. After careful consideration, we've begun implementing new strategies and methods to improve the product we deliver. Yes, I said product because a positive membership experience (spiritually, educationally, socially and communally) is the product you deserve and we aim to deliver.

I often say that it is very easy to say "no"; it takes no talent. The challenge in my position is to say "yes" and figure out ways to satisfy our members, each with individual wants and needs, and to do it all within the framework of the rules, regulations and by-laws of our synagogue's constitution and in keeping with our long-established *minhag*.

Again, I invite you to join me on this exciting, meaningful, unsettling, vibrant journey of change. As people far wiser than I have said, "become part of the solution and not a part of the problem!"


In addition, we will have collection boxes in the synagogue lobby for:

With the High Holy Days behind us and Sukkot and Simchat Torah nearing, here is an easy recipe for a fun fall (or anytime) salad. Happy fall!

CRANBERRY/ PINEAPPLE SALAD

Ingredients:

- 1 can crushed pineapple (in its own juice), not drained
- 2 packages raspberry flavored Ko-Jel or Jello (I use sugar-free)
- 1 can whole berry cranberry sauce
- 2 medium apples (chop one well, save the other one to slice for garnish)
- 2/3 cup chopped walnuts

Preparation:

Drain pineapple, saving the liquid in a 1-quart measuring cup. Save 1 tablespoon of pineapple for the garnish at the end.

Add cold water to saved pineapple juice to measure 3 cups. Pour into a saucepan, bring to boil, and remove from heat.

Add Jello, stirring for 2 minutes until it is all dissolved. Add cranberry sauce and stir until blended (the Jello will not be smooth because of the cranberries). Pour into large bowl and refrigerate for 1 1/2 hours until slightly thickened. Stir in the remaining pineapple, add the apple and walnuts; stir well.

Pour into serving bowl and refrigerate for 4 hours. Garnish with crushed pineapple and some sliced apples.


