TISHA B'AV 2019 - 5779

SATURDAY EVENING, AUGUST 10, AT 8:45 PM

Tisha B'Av, the 9th day of Av, is the saddest and most tragic day in the Jewish year. It commemorates the destruction of the First and Second Temples, as well as other Jewish national calamities. To observe Tisha B'Av we will sit together in the Bodeen Chapel with lit candles to create an atmosphere that reflects the somber mood of the day. The Book of Lamentations, traditionally attributed to the prophet Jeremiah, as he witnessed the First Temple's destruction, is chanted during the Service. The reading of Lamentations and mourning type practices that are also a feature of the day help us to recall the suffering and the persecution of our people throughout the ages. Tisha B'Av is also a day of fasting, which ends the next day at darkness. Please plan to join us for this important evening as Rabbi Weiner and Cantor Weiss lead us in this profoundly moving experience.

SUNDAY MORNING, AUGUST 11, AT 9:00 AM

The morning service for *Tisha B'Av* is unlike any other morning service of the year. Following the tradition of Rabbi Meir of Rothenburg of the 13th century, we do not wear *Talit* or *Tefillin* at the *Shacharit* service. We mourn for the martyrs of our people on this day reciting special prayers after the morning service known as *Kinot*. This special section will be introduced and led by Cantor Weiss.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON, AUGUST 11, AT 1:30 PM

A special early Mincha Service will be held at 1:30 pm on Sunday afternoon. During the Mincha Service, *Talit and Tefillin* are worn, signifying the waning of the intense sorrow of the day.

Please join us for the observance of this significant day in the calendar, so that we may realize the words of our Sages, who taught that "...those who mourn the destruction of Jerusalem will one day be granted the merit to see its glorious redemption."
